SETTING THE STANDARD



Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II are among many of the prominent people who transformed musical theatre into what we see today. Their collaboration launched a new wave of musical theatre, which set a standard for the works following them. Together they won forty-two Tony Awards, fifteen Academy Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes, two Grammy Awards and two Emmy Awards. Even a theatre on Broadway was named after Richard Rodgers! Their success is evident, but let's dive into WHY.

RICHARD RODGERS

Their first show together, *Oklahoma!*, is considered to be one of the greatest musical theater accomplishments of the twentieth-century. The music, the story, and the choreography created a beautiful piece of art for audiences to enjoy. *Oklahoma!* was more than just fun dance numbers and loveable songs. The characters had more complexity, the music was more emotional, and there were scenes with serious themes. In many of their shows, Rodgers and Hammerstein did not shy from social and cultural issues, using the stage as a mechanism to shed light on these things.

"Oklahoma's success is certainly due to many factors. It is true that the idealized Oklahoma depicted in the musical completely sidestepped many of the issues that impacted the actual state. Instead, the show presented a (mostly) sun-lit version of the past...For many viewers, Oklahoma! provided a temporary emotional escape; they could lose themselves in the nostalgia of this tale, set in America's heartland." - Musical Theatre An Appreciation, pg. 245
