Harold reunites with Marian and the entire production sings a joyful final number.

AWARDS GALORE!

This musical, which premiered in 1957, was an instant hit. It was nominated for eight Tony Awards and won five, including Best Musical. Even one of the original actors was given a Theatre World Award for outstanding debut performance in a musical. This show continues to be a favorite among high school theatres and is performed in many community theatres.

The music and lyrics were written by Meredith Wilson. The original broadway cast album spent 245 weeks on the Music Billboard charts. It was so popular that the album won the first ever Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album in 1959! The Music Man has many show stopping songs in the production, so it is no surprise that many people at the time of the premiere were immediately drawn to the music.
